## REQUIRED DATA ELEMENTS FOR COMPLIANCE

The following comparison captures the required data elements for compliance with FDA's FSMA 204 and CFIA's SFCR Tracebility Regulations. It should be noted that some information is required on the case or consumer item, other data is only required in the event of a traceability event. REQUIRED DATA	FSMA 204	SFCR
*SFCR does not specify a Reference Document is required but it is recommended that, if information such as lot codes are available via a Reference Document (such as a Purchase Order or ASN), that Reference Document number be kept as part of the records of the food.  **Although SFCR language notes a lot code or unique identifier can be on, or accompany, cases, it is recommended that a lot code be included on a case (via a label) to meet business requirements.
